x community outings. We believe that each individual we serve has differences, therefore we have many choices to suit the various needs of individuals we serve.

**GROWTH** With the variety of choices available and more new choices added regularly, we have seen a lot of Growth among our participants; not only in age but in learning new

skills, improving oneself, self-control, anger management, developing patience. We have seen individuals who begin working on piece work inconsistently then go on to working in the community competitively. Individuals who come to us feeling lonely then go on to developing friendship and life partners... or come to our

center being dependent on needing to be transported then on to taking public transportation independently... others who have come to us with no background and skills in art becoming artists, learning to paint, create mosaics and make jewelry.

The white bird in the mosaic mural represents FREEDOM... Freedom to come to The Douglas Center...Freedom to choose what you want to do with dignity and respecting Differences ...and FREEDOM to grow without limits!






The Douglas Center is hosting our annual "Winter Wonderland" Art Show & Sale featuring works of art made by their program participants.
