Celebrating National Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month

March is National Developmental Disability Awareness Month as proclaimed by President Ronald Reagan in 1987. This year marks the 32nd anniversary of the signing of the Presidential Proclamation, in which the Reagan urged, "...all Americans to join me in according to our fellow citizens with such disabilities both encouragement and the opportunities they need to lead productive lives and to achieve their full potential."

Developmental disabilities occur among all racial, ethnic and socioeconomic groups. According to the CDC (Center for Disease Control) approximately one in six, or about 15% of children aged 3 through 17 years have one or more developmental disabilities which include ADHD, autism spectrum disorder, cerebral palsy, hearing loss, intellectual disability, learning disability, vision impairment and other developmental delays.

"The Douglas Center is committed to raising public awareness of the many contributions, skills and potential of people with special needs," stated Rifath Khan, CEO of The Douglas Center. In celebration of Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month, The Douglas Center is featured in an exhibit at the Skokie Public Library. The exhibit running through
